We are very excited to take our Nursery and outdoor provision one step further by extending our part time Nursery offer to a Full Time setting with the children spending half the day in our Nursery setting and half the day in our newly refurbished Nursery Forest School. The children will have the opportunity to complement all of their learning in the Nursery session by spending an extended session in the forest, developing skills such as; self-awareness, motivation, empathy, social and communication skills, independence, self-esteem and confidence. In addition children will benefit from the development of physical skills, both gross and fine motor.

Why Forest School?

Forest school at Grimsdell offers children the opportunity to take supported risks appropriate to the environment and to themselves. It allows them to attempt new challenges that they would not face in a classroom. There are opportunities for children to experience the 'classroom' of the outdoors engaging in activities such as tree climbing, making dens, reading in the fresh air and building fires. This adds a sense of excitement and adventure for the children. who are free to explore and manipulate the environment around them using all of their senses. The weather has no impact upon forest schools, whether it be rain or shine, snow or light winds, the children will be outside making the most of the experience. Our newly built cabin will allow space for children to go inside 'within the outside' as an extension of the forest.

In addition to this, it also allows children to be physically active throughout the duration of their lesson, enjoying the fresh air and the new experiences the outdoors can offer. Over the course of Forest School, children's stamina will increase and they will become physically fitter, thus providing a healthier lifestyle.

Forest School offers an excellent opportunity for play and exploration, however, it is the practical tasks linked to the EYFS Foundation Stage which enhance children's development and drives the Forest School initiative. Many of the activities within forest schools are childled, and the activities will follow the direction. in which children choose to take them. They may decide to work independently, working on developing their own problem-solving skills and creativity, or they may join up with other children and work within teams. This is excellent for childrens' social development. as they will learn how to collaborate within a team, and how to share their ideas and to listen to others.










Lunch

We also offer wrap around care from 7:30am until 5:30pm daily.


